Course Description

The aims of this unit are to introduce students to the framework of the general legal system and to provide an overview of various areas of the law. Course topics include formation and legal systems, contract law, the laws of agency, law of torts, consumer protection and business structures of agency, partnership as well as corporations. It will attempt to help students to build up the critical thinking skills, analytic ability, and oral and questioning skills in the context of the study of business law.

Learning Objectives

After studying this course, students should be able to:

- 1. Identify the essential elements of the legal system, including the main sources of law.
- 2. Recognize and apply the appropriate legal rules relating to the law of obligations
- 3. Explain and apply the law relating to employment relationships.
- 4. Recognize and compare types of capital and the financing of companies.

5. Demonstrate and understanding of governance and ethical issues relating to business.

Teaching methods

This course contains lectures, class discussion, homework, quizzes and exams.

Study Time

To do well in this course, students are expected to devote time outside of class for practice and proper preparation. A typical student should need nine hours of no-class time each week during a regular 16-week semester to summarize the cases covered in the readings, pectorals and tutorials. I strongly encourage you to do all assigned homework and extra practice problems.

The answers need not be correct; Homework will be evaluated as complete if all parts of the assignment have been attempted and all work is shown. Assignments will be collected at the beginning of class and late assignments will not be accepted.

Homework assignments should be well kept and returned at the end of the semester.

Presentation

Students are expected to give a group presentation at the mid-end of the semester, which lasts no less than 20 minutes. The topic can be selected from the textbook or lectures. A summary relating to the topic is required before your presentation.

Quizzes and Examinations

There will be at least 2 quizzes during the semester. Quizzes may or may not be announced in advance. Quizzes and mid-term test will test your knowledge of both concepts and the application of those concepts. Final exam may be composed of

computing questions and discussion questions. Students should rely primarily on homework assignments to give them a sense of what they my see for material on exams.
