#### **Course Description**

This is a standards based course on HTML, CSS, JavaScript, and PHP. This course covers the fundamentals of HTML, CSS, JavaScript, and PHP, and shows how to control the structure of a web pages using XHTML, how to style it using CSS, and how to add interactivity using JavaScript and PHP, which is an alternative to HTML and a language for creating web pages with standardized tags which allow users to describe not only the data itself, but also metadata, i.e. information about the structure and organization of data on a web page.

## **Assessment of Student Performance**

## \* Self-Study and Reading ability Practice

Instructor will give out the chapters or the reference books to read and use class hours to have discussion; students should be able to show a proactive attitude and ability for self-study and reading. Knowledge and oral English will be elements of homework or presentation score.

#### # Homework

Students should finish their homework by themselves. Copying from others will be treated as cheating and the homework scores will be lowered. Students should hand in all assignments on time. Late assignments will be accepted at the discretion of the instructor (i.e., when the student was ill or had an excused absence). Late assignments without reasonable proof will be reduced in score by 50%.

Assignment should be printed out. Anything that cannot be read will be marked wrong. Printing requirements are as followed: single space between lines, double space between paragraphs, font size is 12 (maximum). Grammar error can reduce 20% of your score.

#### **☞** Attendance

Because the course covers a great deal of material, attending every class session is very important for performing well.

- Being late for 15 minutes or more is considered an absence.
- Five hours or above of unexcused absences will result in the lower level of the final grade by one grade band (e.g. from C – to D +). Any excused absence must be discussed directly with the teacher.
- Absence which is more than 1/3 of the total teaching hours will cause an F (a failing grade) directly. but students are welcome to continue attending classes.
- An incomplete grade (I) will be considered in case of medical or family emergencies.

#### Participation

- Students should participate in classes actively. Half of participation grade is determined by their presentation in class.
