Course Description

College English II (CE112) is a preliminary part in College English series courses. It focuses on the development of theme-related vocabulary, practical reading, writing and relatively independent communication in daily and basic academic context. Students will be immersed in the English learning environment and have the practical communication skills developed in both autonomous learning and classroom learning processes. This English course helps students to cope well with English environment, to express themselves confidently and efficiently in



oral and written English, thus enhancing the solid foundation for academic English learning.

Teaching Methods

This course contains both online autonomous learning and classroom learning. The Production-oriented Approach is used in the whole teaching process. Lectures, class discussions, homework, quizzes, presentation and exams are included. Textbook content will be introduced first. Then real case and practice questions will be delivered to students as a way to test their understanding of the knowledge. This will require individual or group assignment in or after class.

Grade Criterion

Component	Weight	Description
Final Exam	20%	A cumulative final examination will be given based on all of the contents of the class. The exam paper may be composed of multiple-choice questions, gap filling questions, short answer questions, essay questions, and oral questions, etc. Students should rely primarily on homework assignments to give them a sense of what they may see for material on exams.
Mid-Term Test	20%	A cumulative midterm test will be given based on all of the contents that have been taught in class. The test paper may be mainly composed of subjective and objective questions.
Homework	20%	Most of the assigned homework is taken from the Exercises in the textbook. Assignments will be collected at the clearly stated date. Late assignments will not be accepted. The graded assignments will be kept by the tutor for reference and won't be returned to students.
Quizzes	5%	There will be at least 2 quizzes during the semester. Quizzes may or may not be announced in advance. It may also be used as a way to check the attendance. Quizzes will test your knowledge of both language skills and the application of those skills.
Participation	5%	Individuals will be asked to participate individually in a question and answer at least 5 times during the semester. The performances should be counted in their participation.
Presentation	10%	Topics for presentation will be given to students prior to the delivery. Presentations will be done in either an individual or a team form.
Projects	10%	Projects of Units Production Task will be assessed by teachers and peers.

Assessment of Student Performance

Self-Study and Reading ability Practice

Instructor will give out the chapters or the reference books to read and use class hours to have discussion; students should be able to show a proactive attitude and ability for self-study and reading. Knowledge and oral English will be elements of homework or presentation score.

Homework

Students should finish their homework by themselves. Copying from others will be treated as cheating and the homework scores will be lowered. Students should hand in all assignments on time. Late assignments will be accepted at the discretion of the instructor (i.e., when the student was ill or had an excused absence). Late assignments without reasonable proof will be reduced in score by 50%.

☞ Attendance

Because the course covers a great deal of material, attending every class session is very important for performing well.

- •Being late for 15 minutes or more is considered an absence.
- •Five hours or above of unexcused absences will result in the lower level of the final grade by one grade band (e.g. from C – to D +). Any excused absence must be discussed directly with the teacher.
- •Absence which is more than 1/3 of the total teaching hours will cause an F (a failing grade) directly. but students are welcome to continue attending classes.
- •An incomplete grade (I) will be considered in case of medical or family emergencies.

Participation

- •Students should participate in classes actively. Half of participation grade is determined by their presentation in class. They are encouraged to ask questions relevant to the subject and express their own opinions. Every student should respect the ideas, opinions, and questions of their classmates.
- Students should also use office hours to ask questions or talk with the instructor for good communication and effective learning.
- •Frequent visiting the instructor and chatting in English during office hours is highly recommended.
- *Any misbehavior and non-class related activities in class will result in the lower level of the participation grade, including ringing cell phones.
- •All above behaviors will be solely evaluated by the instructor for scoring.
