Course Description

College English I (CE111) is an introduction to College English series courses. It focuses on the development of basic vocabulary, practical reading, writing and daily communicative skills in English. Students will be immersed in the English learning environment and have the practical communication skills developed in both autonomous learning and classroom learning processes. Through reading and writing, students learn to position their ideas in relation to the ideas of others, while through listening and speaking, students develop skills in describing the general world. Students will also practice critical thinking and develop cross-culture understanding by applying a variety of strategies in this course. This English course is conducive to helping the students to complete their presentations in OCC, and also helping them finish different professional group activities in English.

Teaching Methods

This course contains both online autonomous learning and classroom learning. The Production-oriented Approach is used in the whole teaching process. Lectures, class discussions, homework, quizzes, presentation and exams are included. Textbook content will be introduced first. Then real case and practice questions will be delivered to students as a way to test their understanding of the knowledge. This will require individual or group assignment in or after class.

Assessment of Student Performance

☞ Self-Study and Reading ability Practice

Instructor will give out the chapters or the reference books to read and use class hours to have discussion; students should be able to show a proactive attitude and ability for self-study and reading. Knowledge and oral English will be elements of homework or presentation score.

ℱHomework

Students should finish their homework by themselves. Copying from others will be treated as cheating and the



homework scores will be lowered. Students should hand in all assignments on time. Late assignments will be accepted at the discretion of the instructor (i.e., when the student was ill or had an excused absence). Late assignments without reasonable proof will be reduced in score by 50%.

*Attendance

Because the course covers a great deal of material, attending every class session is very important for performing

- •Being late for 15 minutes or more is considered an absence.
- •Five hours or above of unexcused absences will result in the lower level of the final grade by one grade band (e.g. from C – to D +). Any excused absence must be discussed directly with the teacher.
- •Absence which is more than 1/3 of the total teaching hours will cause an F (a failing grade) directly. but students are welcome to continue attending classes.
- •An incomplete grade (I) will be considered in case of medical or family emergencies.

Participation

- •Students should participate in classes actively. Half of participation grade is determined by their presentation in class. They are encouraged to ask questions relevant to the subject and express their own opinions. Every student should respect the ideas, opinions, and questions of their classmates.
- Students should also use office hours to ask questions or talk with the instructor for good communication and effective learning.
- •Frequent visiting the instructor and chatting in English during office hours is highly recommended.
- *Any misbehavior and non-class related activities in class will result in the lower level of the participation grade, including ringing cell phones.
- •All above behaviors will be solely evaluated by the instructor for scoring.
