Course Description

in both spoken and written English, and build a strong foundation for advanced academic English studies.

Teaching Methods

This course combines online autonomous learning with classroom instruction, utilizing the Production-Oriented Approach throughout the teaching process. The course incorporates a variety of methods, including lectures, class discussions, homework assignments, quizzes, presentations, and exams.

The teaching process begins with an introduction to the textbook content, followed by the application of knowledge through real-world case studies and practice questions. These activities are designed to assess students' understanding and encourage active engagement. Students will complete individual or group assignments, both during and outside of class, to reinforce their learning and develop practical skills.

Component	Weight	Description
Final Exam	20%	A cumulative final examination will be given based on all of the contents of the class. The exam paper may be composed of multiple-choice questions, gap filling questions, short answer questions, essay questions, and oral questions, etc. Students should rely primarily on homework assignments to give them a sense of what they may see for material on exams.
Mid-Term Test	20%	A cumulative midterm test will be given based on all of the contents that have been taught in class. The test paper may be mainly composed of subjective and objective questions.
Homework	20%	Most of the assigned homework is taken from the Exercises in the textbook. Assignments will be collected at the clearly stated date. Late assignments will not be accepted. The graded assignments will be kept by the tutor for reference and won't be returned to students.
Quizzes	5%	There will be at least 2 quizzes during the semester. Quizzes may or may not be announced in advance. It may also be used as a way to check the attendance. Quizzes will test your knowledge of both language skills and the application of those skills.
Participation	5%	Individuals will be asked to participate individually in a question and answer at least 5 times during the semester. The performances should be



		counted in their participation.
Presentation	10%	Topics for presentation will be given to students prior to the delivery. Presentations will be done in either an individual or a team form.
Projects	10%	Projects of Units Production Task will be assessed by teachers and peers.

Assessment of Student Performance

𝕊 Self-Study and Reading ability Practice

Instructor will give out the chapters or the reference books to read and use class hours to have discussion; students should be able to show a proactive attitude and ability for self-study and reading. Knowledge and oral English will be elements of homework or presentation score.

The Homework

Students should finish their homework by themselves. Copying from others will be treated as cheating and the homework scores will be lowered. Students should hand in all assignments on time. Late assignments will be accepted at the discretion of the instructor (i.e., when the student was ill or had an excused absence). Late assignments without reasonable proof will be reduced in score by 50%.

Attendance

Because the course covers a great deal of material, attending every class session is very important for performing well.

- •Being late for 15 minutes or more is considered an absence.
- Five hours or above of unexcused absences will result in the lower level of the final grade by one grade band (e.g. from C to D +). Any excused absence must be discussed directly with the teacher.
- •Absence which is more than 1/3 of the total teaching hours will cause an F (a failing grade) directly.
- but students are welcome to continue attending classes.
- An incomplete grade (I) will be considered in case of medical or family emergencies.

Participation

- Students should participate in classes actively. Half of participation grade is determined by their presentation in class. They are encouraged to ask questions relevant to the subject and express their own opinions. Every student should respect the ideas, opinions, and questions of their classmates.
- Students should also use office hours to ask questions or talk with the instructor for good communication and effective learning.
- •Frequent visiting the instructor and chatting in English during office hours is highly recommended.
- Any misbehavior and non-class related activities in class will result in the lower level of the participation grade, including ringing cell phones.
- •All above behaviors will be solely evaluated by the instructor for scoring.
